**Speaker Series: "Rosie the Riveter"** *Thursday, March 9 at 7 pm* 

Debi Wynn from the Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum will discuss the important role of Rosie the Riveter in manufacturing during World War II. During WWII, Essex and Middle River was the destination for folks in search of employment. Discover how Glenn Martin's hiring of 19 women for his Eastern Blvd. aircraft manufacturing company launched the Rosie the Riveter movement and contributed to bringing the war to an end while creating social change in the workplace. Attendees to this presentation with a Rosie in their family are invited to bring a photo of their Rosie to briefly share where she worked and the job she did. Doors open at 6:30 pm. Visitors are welcome to tour the Museum after the talk.
